COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT ACTION PLAN (CDAP)

SCOPE OF WORK (SOW): SUPPORT FOR EDUCATION AND INFRASTRUCTURE (SCHOOL, LEARNING MATERIALS AND FURNITURE DONATION)

1.0 BACKGROUND

The Marampa Mines Limited is company that is working in the Marampa Chiefdom where Lunsar is situated as the major town closest to the mining operations and most of the workers or their relatives who come to support the services provided by the workforce to the MML are living within and or around Lunsar community. To comply with the EIA licenses mandate for the MML operations, Community Development Action Plan (CDAP) section in the MML's ESHIA document is a compulsory component to be implemented. Support for Education and Infrastructure is part of the projects nominated to be implemented in the host communities. This SOW seeks to procure and supply school/learning materials to pupils and furniture, and sanitary containers to selected 21 primary schools in the two host chiefdoms-Marampa and Maforki in Port Loko district, Northwestern Sierra Leone. Some of the schools are AHMADIYA primary, Sierra Leone Church Primary, Roman Catholic Primary, etc. Most of the selected schools are government assisted whilst few are community led with no government assistance currently though they are eagerly awaiting adoption by the government through the ministry of basic and secondary education.

1.1 PROJECT DURATION PLAN

Implementation is anticipated to be done within three months, October to December 2023. All things being equal distribution of the learning and schools' materials will be in last week of October or early November whilst furniture and sanitary containers will be delivered to the schools in last week of November or early December 2023.

1.2 OBJECTIVE OF THE PROJECT

The overall objective of this project is to improve pupils' education and schools' infrastructure and learning facilities in the two host chiefdoms of MML operations.

1.3 SPECIFIC OBJECTIVES

The following are some of the rationales of the intervention, though not exhaustive:

- 1. To comply with regulatory requirements.
- 2. To procure and distribute school and learning materials to selected 21 schools in the two chiefdoms.
- 3. Contribute to education empowerment in the district, region, and the country.
- 4. Partner with existing government structures to improve education.
- 5. To improve schools' infrastructure and learning facilities in the host communities.
- 6. To encourage and motivate excellent performing pupils and care for the less privileged in community schools.
- 7. Contribute to the local content component of the MML.



2.0 SCOPE

The school and learning materials will be procured from local vendors for distribution to pupils in the 21 selected schools. Wooden furniture will be processed, fabricated, and assembled by a local carpentry and joinery workshop in Lunsar and delivered to 21 primary schools in the two chiefdoms by MML dedicated team. Additionally, procured sanitary containers will also be part of the donation to the schools.

2.1 COMPLETION DATE

The school and learning materials are expected to be procured and distributed to 1050 pupils from the 21 selected schools in October/November whilst the processed and fabricated furniture is expected to be completed and delivered in addition to the sanitary containers to the schools in November/December 2023. It is estimated that 100 sets of desks and benches will be completed every week.

2.2 REPORTING

The carpenter shall provide weekly updates on the progress of the woodwork fabricated furniture.

2.3 DESCRIPTION OF SCOPE OF WORK

The furniture will be fabricated from woodworks to produce 1050 sets of benches and desks (1050 benches and 1050 desks. Also 84 sets of tables and chairs (84 chairs and 84 tables) will be done. Tables 2.3.1 and 2.3.4 display detailed outline of the activities to be executed that are enshrined in this scope of the work.

2.3.1 Scope of Work for the woodwork furniture

Local carpentry and joinery vendor will do the fabrication of the furniture using local forest wood

Source the best wood materials suitable for the furniture-Yemanie board 1" by 12 " by 12' and 2" by 10" by 12'

Mobilization of forest boards and other materials to the carpentry and joinery workshop in Lunsar

Sawing and cleaning of the boards

Processing of the boards

Fabrication and assemblage of the furniture

Delivery of the furniture to the 21 selected schools in the two chiefdoms by ESG and CR&D team

3.0 SUMMARY ON SCOPE OF WORK

A total of 1,050 pupils from primary one to six will benefit directly from the school supply materials namely: books, pens, pencils, erasers, and a backpack/school bag that will contain the items. Selection criteria of beneficiary ranges from pupils with disability such as hearing impairment-deaf & dumb, handicaps, brilliant/excellent pupils (first five best pupils), less privileged, pupils that trek from other communities or villages for about 1 km or more to access education facility in other localities. An estimate of about 6,377 or more pupils will benefit (1,966 from nine schools in Maforki and 4,411 or more from twelve schools in Marampa) in general from the furniture and sanitary containers such as desks, benches, chairs, tables, and water storage plastic drums/buckets with lid that will be donated to the 21 selected schools.

The procured learning and school materials will be distributed in a momentous programme that will take place at the parish hall in Lunsar. Pupils from the 12 schools in Marampa chiefdom and one from Maforki chiefdom-Rogbesseh village close to Lunsar will be conveyed using MML hired buses to the parish hall for the ceremony. Dignitaries from within the district and chiefdoms such as Paramount of Chiefs of Marampa and Maforki, Deputy Director of Education-Pork Loko district, Local Unit Commander of the Sierra Leoine Police (SLP) force, resident National Minerals Agency representative, heads of the converging schools, will be invited to witness the program. Representatives of MML Management will be there as well. Major distribution of the school & learning materials will be done at the ceremony with one set of furniture and sanitary containers displayed for one of the closest schools at the hall. The ceremony will hold on Saturday to allow access to the MML hired buses since work force usage of the vehicles would have reduced.

The rest of the other learning materials in addition to the future and sanitary containers for the 8 schools in Maforki chiefdom will be delivered on suitable days with hired trucks. Moreso, furniture and sanitary items for the other schools in Marampa chiefdom will be delivered as well with the hired trucks.
